

Biography



Adam Majsay Music Director

Over the past two decades, Adam has built a strong reputation as a choral conductor and believes strongly in the power of community singing, pairing high musical expectations with a focus on enjoyment through collective music-making. Adam's investment in the development of Australian choral repertoire has led to the commissioning of a number of new Australian choral works.

Beyond his work with choirs, Adam is a seasoned stage performer, having performed principal roles in music theatre and chamber opera, with his stage performances featured in the Sydney Gay and Lesbian Mardi Gras Festival, Sydney Festival and Queer Fringe for the Sydney Fringe Festival. Adam counts more than twenty musical and dramatic productions as either musical director, director, conductor or repetiteur.

Adam commenced his work with Sydney Gay & Lesbian Choir in 2015, and has been the Choir's Music Director since 2017.

Biography



Kane Wheatley Principal Pianist

Kane is a Sydney-based performer, musical director and educator. By day Kane works as a teacher and conductor for choral, band and musical theatre programs and is the musical director for the St George Performing Arts Festival for the Department of Education. Kane has appeared in many productions as a pianist, percussionist and musical director both here in Australia and overseas. He has also musically directed shows for both the Sydney and Adelaide Fringe Festivals and the Adelaide Cabaret Festival.

Kane commenced as Principal Pianist for Sydney Gay & Lesbian Choir in 2020, having played for the Choir on a number of occasions in previous years.
